Thanksgiving – November 26-27, 2020

Thanksgiving Day in the United States is a holiday on the fourth Thursday of November. The day after is also known as Black Friday.

Is Thanksgiving Day a Public Holiday?

Thanksgiving Day is a public holiday. It is a day off for the general population, and schools and most businesses are closed.

Family Celebration

Thanksgiving Day is a day for people in the US to give thanks for what they have. Families and friends get together for a meal, which traditionally includes a roast turkey, stuffing, potatoes, vegetables, cranberry sauce, gravy, and pumpkin pie.

In some cities and towns, there are parades during the Thanksgiving weekend. In most areas, these festivities also mark the opening of the Christmas shopping season.

Long Weekend in More Than 20 States

The Day After Thanksgiving, also known as Black Friday, is a holiday in more than 20 states. It's common to take trips and visit family and friends during the long weekend.

Many Have the Day Off

Most government offices, businesses, schools, universities, colleges, and other organizations are closed on Thanksgiving Day. Many offices and businesses allow staff to have a long four-day weekend for Thanksgiving, so these offices and businesses are also closed on the Day after Thanksgiving Day. Public transit systems usually do not operate on their regular timetables.

Thanksgiving Day is one of the busiest periods for travel in the USA. This can cause congestion and overcrowding. Seasonal parades and busy football games can also cause disruption to local traffic.

US Holiday Since 1863

Thanksgiving Day has been an annual holiday in the United States since 1863. However, not everyone sees Thanksgiving Day as a cause for celebration.

Beginning in 1970, a group of Native Americans and their supporters have staged an annual protest for a National Day of Mourning at Plymouth Rock in Plymouth, Massachusetts on Thanksgiving Day. American Indian Heritage Day is also observed at this time of the year.

There are claims that the first Thanksgiving Day was held in the city of El Paso, Texas, in 1598. Another early event was held in 1619 in the Virginia Colony. Many people trace the origins of the modern Thanksgiving Day to the harvest celebration the Pilgrims held in Plymouth, Massachusetts in 1621. However, their first true thanksgiving was in 1623, when they gave thanks for rain that ended a drought. These early thanksgivings took the form of a special church service, rather than a feast.

In the second half of the 1600s, thanksgivings after the harvest became more common and started to become annual events. However, they were celebrated on different days in different communities and in some places, there were more than one thanksgiving each year. George Washington, the first president of the United States, proclaimed the first national Thanksgiving Day in 1789.

Al and Vivian traveled for years, attending classes across the country to perfect the art of breadmaking. The love Al developed for old time bread artistry can be discovered in each bite. Come on by and see just how serious this bread truly is.

Know your sourdough

Sourdough is a probiotic because the fermentation process increases the content of beneficial bacteria in the bread.



Sourdough often has a lower glycemic index than that of other breads - meaning it does not spike blood sugar as dramatically. This is because it breaks down complex starches within it, simply by its fermented nature.



Sourdough preparation is lengthier and the longer prep time results in the protein gluten being broken down into amino acids. This translates to easier and more pleasant digestion, sometimes even for those who are sensitive to gluten.

Darwell's Café - Long Beach

Cajun food on the Mississippi Coast, USA TODAY Published, 2016

The scene: It doesn't get much more laid back than Darwell's Café, a true roadside joint that is literally on the other side of the tracks. Oceanfront Beach Boulevard is the main drag in these parts, running along America's longest manmade beach, but Darwell's sits off Railroad Street, which runs parallel several blocks inland, along the tracks. Long Beach, a small neighbor of Biloxi, is home to the University of Southern Mississippi, and was once known as the Radish Capital of the World. The area is now a major tourism destination, with Biloxi and Gulfport full of marinas, museums, golf courses and casinos. But while Darwell's is very close to these, you would never drive by or find it if you were not looking for it. Nonetheless, lots and lots of people come looking for it, and Darwell's, though much bigger than it looks, is routinely jammed with a long line out the door, especially on weekends.

The main building has several inside dining rooms, and there is a vast outdoor dining area full of large tables. At maximum capacity it can hold a couple of hundred folks

and often does, with live music nightly, indoor or out. As soon as you walk in you are at the counter, where the normal greeting is to ask whether it's your first time, and if you say yes, a sample of their signature crawfish etouffee is handed to you. You order at the counter, which has handwritten specials and menu items hanging over it and on the walls on either side. Then you are handed a number, make your way to the iced tea stand to grab a beverage (it's BYOB for adult beverages), then find a table. Food is delivered to you with the same ultra-friendly service that pervades the place.

Darwell's is funky, and the walls are covered with whimsical art, caricatures, song lyrics and cartoon-like drawings, mostly by the owner's father "Papa D," who is known to wander around and spontaneously draw caricatures of customers on Styrofoam cups for instant keepsakes, or pull out a harmonica and start jamming with the band. Colorfully painted guitars hang on the walls, endless strings of Christmas lights dangle from the ceilings, and it is a place of wonder at every turn. Even the otherwise barren concrete floors are whimsically painted with colorful designs. The exception is the front dining room, by the counter, which is covered with more conventional framed article clippings and awards, and a signed poster-sized photo of TV personality Guy Fieri. He brought his show *Diners, Drive-Ins and Dives* here specifically for the crawfish etouffee, which he loved so much he included the recipe in his *DDD Cookbook*.

Bozo's first opened its doors in 1956 and since then has become a destination point for locals and people from all walks of life up and down the entire Gulf Coast from Louisiana to Florida. Not only is it a place of choice for Gulf Coast residents it is a favorite for people traveling the I-10 corridor from all over the United States. Bozo's is also recognized throughout the World as visitors from many countries including Japan, Australia, England, Norway, Sweden and even Russia come to enjoy the great tasting food. Owner Keith Delcambre is the Grandson of EJ Delcambre "Bozo" (founder of Bozo's) and the son of Russell Paul Delcambre. Bozo's is a third-generation family business and Keith is proud to say over the 6 decades Bozo's ambience has not changed and still remains a small-town local seafood dive. One of the most unique features of Bozo's is all of the food whether its fried, steamed or grilled is cooked to order. Bozo's is recognized and known throughout the United States and World as one of the "must go places" for mouthwatering fresh seafood and great Po Boys. Bozo's is ranked in the Top 20 Seafood

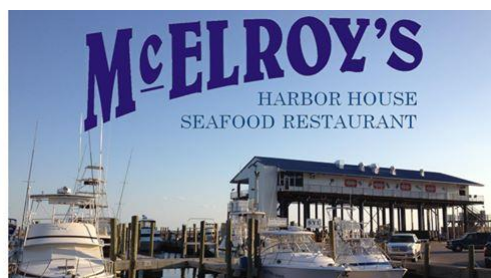

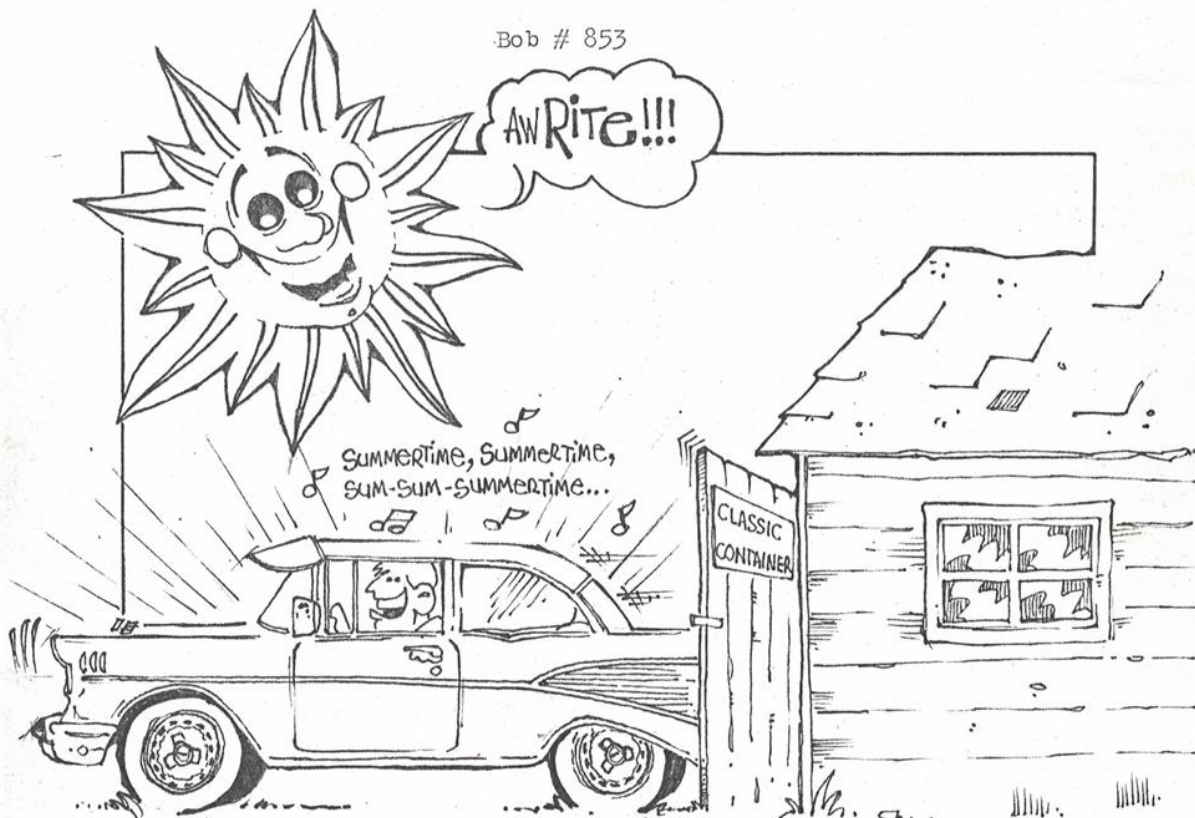
But it's not just the ones making it to the convention that are busy. Dewayne McAllister has recently installed a Turbo transmission in his Nomad and just got the car painted.

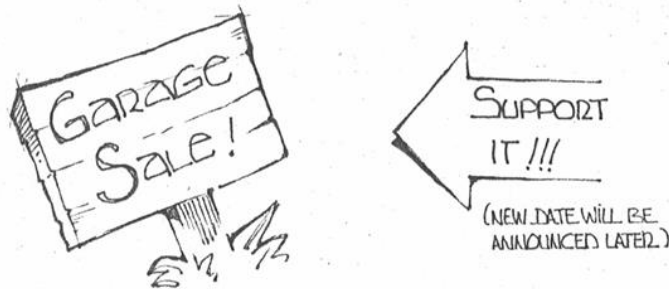

The meeting was adjourned at 5:00 P.M.



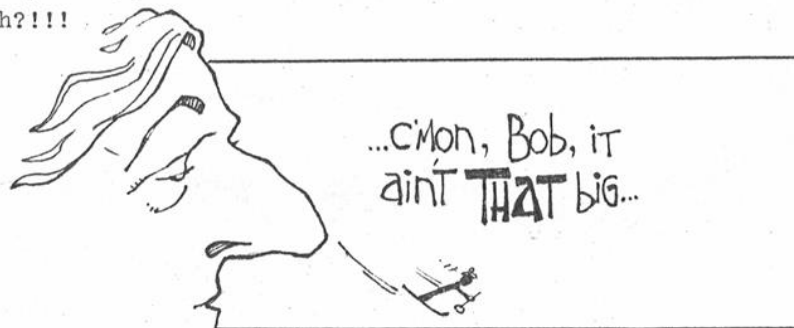
TIDBITS AND TRIVIA

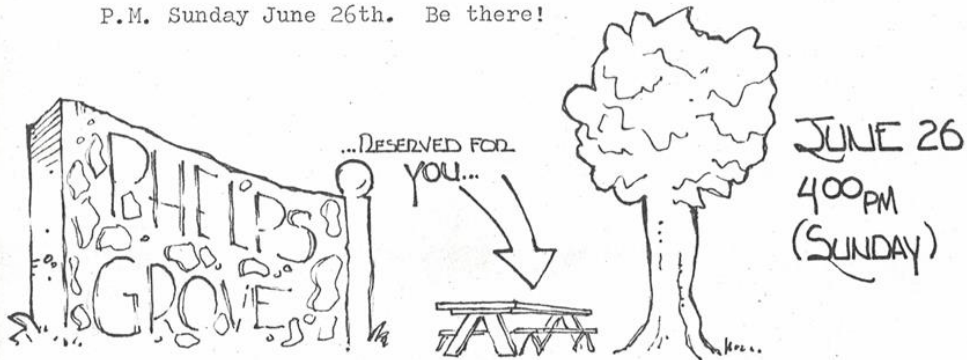

The next time I paint it I think I can do a better job. And I can still say --- I did it all with the help of my wife, Helen, Kenny, and a good friend, Terry Brumley.

The engine is a stock 327 F.I. short block, that I balanced and blue printed, 300 h.p. heads, a 780 dual line Holley carb, a 400 Turbo hooked to the column; 3.55 gears, black Porcelainized stock headers, all new suspension front and rear, air shocks, Turbo mag wheels and Mickey Thompson series 60 tires, a combination of Chevelle and Camaro disc brakes on the front with stock brakes on the rear; power steering, using a stock slave cylinder and a late model pump.

The interior has a Chevelle tilt column; power windows that were purchased from fellow club member Dewayne McAllister, all new tinted glass except for the rear window. The wing vents were etched by the glass artist at Silver Dollar City. The seat is out of a 1974 Dodge Charger. The complete interior was designed and stitched up by my wife. I may be a little prejudiced, but I think she done a fantastic job on it. Be sure to note the unusual headlining.

The air conditioning is by way of a late model G.M. Compressor and a motor home evaporator unit that is concealed under the floor behind the drivers seat.

All the bright work was either replated by Acme Plating in K.C. or polished by myself.

The paint is a '74 Ford Metallic brown lacquer, and all the suspension parts, frame, rear end and under hood parts are painted Black Imron.

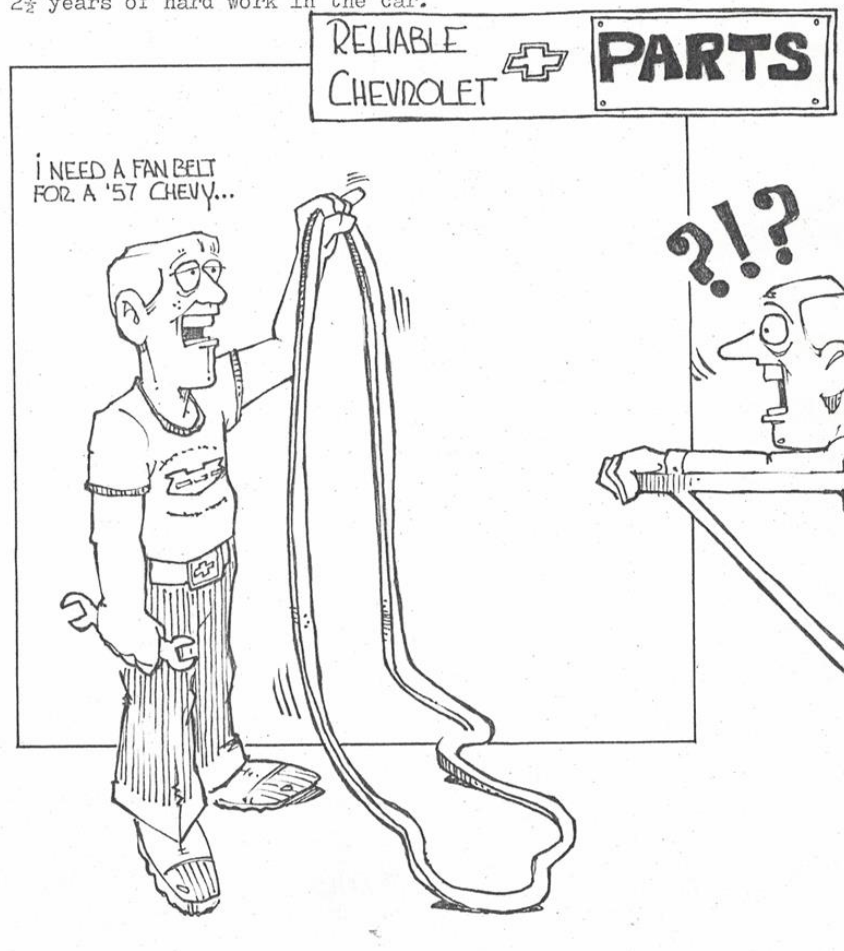
