


BLUE CHEESE DRESSING - Cindy Clark


Congratulations are in order to Bob and Paula Alford, they have become Grandparents for the first time to a baby girl born August 31st.

REVISED BY-LAWS

October 29, 1978

REQUIREMENTS FOR MEMBERSHIP:

- 1. You must own or intend to purchase a 1955-56-57 Chevrolet any model, car or truck.
- 2. You must be a National Classic Chevy Club member.
- 3. One membership required per household.

DUES:

- The Springfield Chapter dues are \$10.00 annually.
 A. All dues will be considered due in August.
- Members annual dues not paid within 60 days will be dropped from the club.
- 3. New members will be allowed 60 days grace period. New members dues will be pro-rated at \$1.00 per month.
- 4. The National dues are \$15.00 annually.
- No refunds will be made of dues if a member drops out of the club.

RULES FOR MEMBERS:

- 1. It should also be each members duty (through their enjoyment of their cars and club) to actively encourage membership to all prospective members seen on the street.
- 2. Only paid up members may attend club functions.
- Only paid up members may vote on club functions.
 A. Men and women votes are equal.
- 4. Members may vote by absentee, by contacting the President or any officer before the meeting on any up coming motion.
- All by-laws standing and or admendments to by-laws require 2/3 majority vote. All other motions require simple majority.

RULES FOR OFFICERS:

1. Any officer will be removed from office if he or she misses 3 consecutive meetings.

MEETING PROCEDURE - PARLIMENTARY PROCEDURE:

- 1. Call meeting to order.
- 2. Recognition of visitors.
- 3. Treasurer report.
- 4. Secretary report.
- 5. The floor is now open for discussion of any old business.
- 6. The floor is now open for discussion of any new business.
- 7. Adjournment, only after all motions during the meeting have been either defeated passed or tabled.

OFFICERS DUTIES:

PRESIDENT

- 1. Conduct meeting in business like manner.
- 2. Must show good representation of Classic Chevy Club.

VICE PRESIDENT

- 1. Conduct meeting during absence of President.
- 2. Help advise all officers.

SECRETARY

- 1. Keep accurate minutes of all meetings.
- Should work collectively with Public Relations and Editor handling all correspondence.
- 3. Keep records of all club activities.

TREASURER

- 1. Collect dues.
- 2. Keep an accurate record of all finances and expenses.

SARGENT OF ARMS

1. Keep order during all club functions.

PUBLIC RELATIONS

- Should work collectively with Secretary and Editor handling all correspondence.
- 2. Keep scrap book up to date of all club activities.

The club reserves the right to have the Sargent of Arms ask any club member or visitor that is being unruly to leave the meeting or club function.
