Father's Day is June 21

Father's Day in the United States is on the third Sunday of June. It celebrates the contribution that fathers and father figures make for their children's lives. Its origins may lie in a memorial service held for a large group of men, many of them fathers, who were killed in a mining accident in Monongah, West Virginia in 1907.

Is Father's Day a Public Holiday?

Father's Day is not a public holiday. It falls on Sunday, June 21, 2020 and most businesses follow regular Sunday opening hours in the United States.

Father's Day is a day for fathers and father-like figures.

What Do People Do?

Father's Day is an occasion to mark and celebrate the contribution that your own father has made to your life. Many people send or give cards or gifts to their fathers. Common Father's Day gifts include sports items or clothing, electronic gadgets, outdoor cooking supplies and tools for household maintenance.

Father's Day is a relatively modern holiday so different families have a range of traditions. These can range from a simple phone call or greetings card to large parties honoring all of the 'father' figures in a particular extended family. Father figures can include fathers, step-fathers, fathers-in-law, grandfathers and great-grandfathers and even other male relatives. In the days and weeks before Father's Day, many schools and Sunday schools help their pupils to prepare a handmade card or small gift for their fathers.

Public Life

Father's Day is not a federal holiday. Organizations, businesses and stores are open or closed, just as they are on any other Sunday in the year. Public transit systems run to their normal Sunday schedules. Restaurants may be busier than usual, as some people take their fathers out for a treat.

Background and symbols

There are a range of events, which may have inspired the idea of Father's Day. One of these was the start of the Mother's Day tradition in the first decade of the 20th century. Another was a memorial service held in 1908 for a large group of men, many of them fathers, who were killed in a mining accident in Monongah, West Virginia in December 1907.

A woman called Sonora Smart Dodd was an influential figure in the establishment of Father's Day. Her father raised six children by himself after the death of their mother. This was uncommon at that time, as many widowers placed their children in the care of others or quickly married again.

Sonora was inspired by the work of Anna Jarvis, who had pushed for Mother's Day celebrations. Sonora felt that her father deserved recognition for what he had done. The first time Father's Day was held in June was in 1910. Father's Day was officially recognized as a holiday in 1972 by President Nixon.



Several things to know for the cruise: Gas in Aurora is 40 cents a gallon higher than Nixa, so I would recommend gassing up before the cruise starts. Also, I cannot guarantee that any stations in Aurora have non-ethanol premium. (See change below) The cruise, round trip from/to Nixa, is approximately 80 miles. It is 62 miles from Nixa to Republic. As you reach a good dropping off point after Republic (or before) to head home feel free to do so. Although there are several drive-through eating places in Aurora I could only confirm use of a restroom at Braum's. For this reason, I recommend everyone eat in the parking lot of Braum's. If you choose to drive through another fast food location please come to Braum's parking lot to eat instead of Sutherlands as originally planned. We will leave Aurora to continue our cruise from the Braum's parking lot. We will have a map available for everyone along with mileage marker guidance for turns. I am very excited to see everyone and get out on what looks to be a beautiful day for a cruise. See everyone at 10 a.m. in the Marco's parking lot in Nixa.

SEYMOUR CRUISE - MAY 23rd, 2020

From the parking lot of the Ozark Walmart turn right onto the 14 Highway and continue $36\ \mathrm{miles}$ to Ava.

In Ava you will come to a stop light which is Highway 5. Continue through the light. You will see a Signal station immediately on the left. We will gather at the station for a 20 minute pit stop. No Ethanol premium is also available if you need to top off your tank.

From the Signal station turn right onto Highway 14 then an immediate right onto Highway 5. Travel approximately 12 miles on the 5 and you will come to Highway 60. Cross Highway 60 and turn left on F.

After two miles turn right to stay on F.

Travel 7 miles and turn left on V. Start watching for horse and buggies at this point. There are numerous Amish farms on the route.

After 6 miles you will come to C. Turn left onto C.


Travel approximately 3 miles to Highway 60. Cross over Highway 60. After crossing the 60 turn left onto Center Avenue. (Watch closely here, Clinton St. is immediately before Center Avenue and more prominent than Center Ave. You can easily turn onto Clinton by mistake if not paying attention.)

Travel about 2 blocks to Main St. Turn left on Main St. and you will see the town square on the right. Please park on the north or west side of the square.

From Seymour back to Ozark: Leave the Square by turning right onto Main St. Turn right onto Summit Ave. Turn left onto Division then right on Mack St. which becomes BB.

On BB travel approximately 12 miles to Highway 14. Turn right on Highway 14 back to Ozark.

Interesting facts about the Seymour area courtesy of Charles Mahaffey. (Thanks Charles!)
Cedar Gap and Seymour both are on the highpoint of the Ozark Plateau. They are approx. 500
ft. higher than Springfield. Five never start close to Seymour. To the north the Niangua and
Gasconade begin. East close to Cedar Gap the Bryant begins. Just north of Seymour the James
begins and south, the Findley. Our proposed route will be on V north of Seymour. Before
intersecting Cabout half to 3/4 to east, a small stream is on south of V, then you will cross small
bridge and the stream will be on north of V. This area is the headwaters of the James river.
