## In Springfield and around the state....

1991

1992 -

George H. Bush was in the area during his time in office, attending Marshfield's 4th of July celebration. River Salvage opens the Arabia Steamboat Museum in the historic River Market area of Kansas City.

Missouri voters approved riverboat gambling on the Mississippi and Missouri Rivers 1993 –

The Great Flood of 1993 devastated parts of Missouri and the Midwest 1995 –

Scientists, archeologists and descendants gathered in Kearney to dig up Jesse James' grave. Tests will be done to determine if Jesse is really buried there. There have been rumors that he was not murdered by a gang member, that he faked his death, that he fathered other children, etc.

1996 -

Former British Prime Minister Margaret Thatcher delivered a major address at Westminster College in Fulton 2000 -

The Missouri State Veterans Cemetery in Springfield is a partnership between the Department of Veterans Affairs and the Missouri Veterans Commission. The first interment was conducted on 10 January 2000. Situated on 60 tranquil acres, the cemetery has an approximate capacity of 30,000 gravesites.
