- 11. The first speeding ticket was issued in 1902. At this time, most cars could only drive up to 45 mph.

- 24. The first Ford cars made actually had Dodge engines.


Marshfield Cruisers Cruise-Ins








First Club Meeting of 2023 – April 16, 2023



New Location for Marshfield Cruisers

For the past seven years, the management of Young's Shopping Center have allowed the Marshfield Cruisers to host the monthly cruise-in on the shopping center parking lot. It was an ideal location, convenient, visible to passersby who often stopped to see the cars and with some necessary amenities. But as the saying goes, "all good things must come to an end".

With the increase in patronage to the new restaurant as well as the fitness centers and a soon to open business in the old Price Cutter building, the Cruisers found it necessary to look for other locations.

Much discussion has taken place over the past few months, considering the pros and cons of each, and a decision has been reached to accept the offering of the First Baptist Church, 1001 S. White Oak, to host the cruise-in on their south parking lot. Restrooms will be available as well as a drinking fountain. Spectators are asked to park their vehicles on the north parking lot.

Directions: Coming from the west, signs will be posted on Jackson Street (Hwy 38) directing cruisers to turn right on White Oak and continue south to the church on the right. (If this crossing is too low, one might consider continuing one block east on Jackson to Clay, then one block south on Clay to Maple, then West on Maple to White Oak.) Those coming in on A Hwy, look for a sign at Commerce at the south edge of the City, then west to White Oak and north on White Oak to the church.

While this move is inconvenient and poses needed adjustments to be made for all involved, the Cruisers are encouraged at the economic outlook displayed by these thriving businesses and the prospects of a new business in town. The Cruisers wish them well along with Young's Shopping Center for allowing the past use of their lot.
