

Body and frame must be as manufactured. Replacement of safety items such as glass, exhaust system, shocks, etc., is allowed. Original drive train (engine, transmission, rear end, and suspension) must be retained, with necessary rebuilding allowed. If engine serial number body number, or engine suffix (letters) is incorrect or does not exist. zero points will be given for engine, engine compartment only. Interior materials may be repaired or replaced with duplicate original or exact reproduction. Not to exceed 25% of total area of interior. Exterior (body and paint) may be repaired or repainted, not to exceed 35% of total of exterior, paint must correspond with cowl tag paint number if vehicle is painted any other color than is indicated on the cowl tag, zero points will be given. 25 points will be deeducted from total score for trailered.

#### RESTORED -- CRIGINAL

Body and frame must be as manufactured. Criginal type drive train (engine, transmission, rearend, and suspension) rust be retained, with necessary rebuilding or replacement allowed. Engine in vehicle must correspond with engine letter in body serial number. Wrong engine will receive zero points. Exhaust system will be judged as follows: No glass packs, no shortened tailpipes, correct exhaust follows: No glass packs, no shortened talipipes, correct exhaust manifolds, original type muffler, and correct hangers—for all three years. Replacement of entire interior with duplicate original or exact reproduction material is allowed. Body work and complete paint is allowed as long as correct paint colors are used in conjunction with paint number on cowl tag. Rechroning of existing original interior paint number on cowl tag. Rechroming of existing original 'nterior and exterior chrome and/or reproduction chrome is allowed. 25 points will be deducted from total score for trailered.

A MCDIFICATION CONTITUTES ANY CHANGE FROM CRISINAL ENGINE, ORIGINAL LUPHCLSTERY AND INTERIOR, OR ORIGINAL PAINT AND BCDY.

(1) Engine and/or drive train--Example: If engine is not correct

- for the year model.
- Upholstery and/or interior -- Example: If interior does not match cowl tag paint number.
- Body and paint -- Example: If paint does not match cowl tag maint number.

This class must have two (2) rodifications in any of the three major components: 10% will be deducted from total score for each modifications beyond the two alled. 25 points will be deducted from total score for trailered. No sheet metal modifications allowed. Any type wheels and tires permitted.

#### MODIFIED

This class must have three (3) modifications in the three major conponents 10% will be deducted from total score if vehicle has extensive sheet metal modifications: Xiror sheet metal modification are allowed as long as original body lines are retained. 25 points will be deducted from total scored for trailered. Any type wheels and tires permitted.

ALL ORIGINAL, SEMI-MODIFIED, MODIFIED: CLASSES WILL BE SEPARATED INTO 1955, 1955; 1957: 1-2-3- PLACE TROPHIES IN ALL THREE YEARS.

This class is for '55. '56, '57, all body styles in competition together, no year separation, only one trophy will be awarded: Eest overall custom. This class must have complete modifications in three major components plus extensive detailing of undercarriage. A modification constitutes a complete change from original engine, original upholstery and interior. or original paint and body.

#### EXAMPLES:


- (1) Complete detailed underside-sheet metal and chrome
  (2) Complete exterior change
  (3) Complete interior change
  (4) Complete engine change


- (5) Suspension modifications, such as disc brakes and independent rear suspension
- (6) Chroming of suspension parts
- (7) Coustom painting of floor pan (8) Sheet metal modifications
- VEHICLE MAY BE TRAILERED, NO POINTS DEDUCTED

CCRVETTES Corvettes will be in competition together: No years separation. 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place will be given.

### PICKUPS AND/OR TRUCKS

These will also be in competition together: No year separation with 1-2-3 place trophies awarded.






