Child Health Care Day, October 4, 2021

Child Health Day in the United States raises people's awareness of how they can protect and develop children's health. This event is annually celebrated on the first Monday of October.

Is Child Health Day a Public Holiday? Child Health Day is not a public holiday. Businesses have normal opening hours.

Child Health Day aims to help people learn more about how they can protect and develop their children's health.

What Do People Do?

As part of the annual presidential proclamation for the day, all agencies and organizations interested in child welfare are invited to unite on Child Health Day to observe exercises to stimulate or increase people's awareness of the need for a year-round program to protect and develop children's health in the United States.

Health professionals and health organizations across the United States take part in this day through various activities and events. For example, the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) takes on an active role in providing educational resources for parents, children and schools about issues such as healthy choices, fitness, and child obesity prevention. The HRSA also calls for every surgeon general across the nation to make a pledge towards providing a healthy future for children.

The Maternal and Child Health Library also actively participates in Child Health Day through activities that focus on healthy eating and physical activity for children and their parents or parental figures. The library provides information on nutrition for children and adolescents, the importance of physical activity, and nutrition for pregnant women.

Public Life

Although Child Health Day is a national observance in the United States, it is not a public holiday.

Background

Calvin Coolidge was the first president to issue a proclamation for Child Health Day in 1928 and it was annually observed on May 1 until it was observed on the first Monday of October from 1960 onwards. The concept of this event was supported by organizations such as the American Child Health Association, the American Federation of Labor and the General Federation of Women's Clubs in the early 20th century.

According to the HRSA, about one in six children between 2 and 19 in the United States is overweight. This is a risk factor for serious health consequences including asthma, diabetes and heart disease. Child Health Day helps spark or increase people's awareness of ways to minimize or alleviate health problems that children may face. The day focuses on a range of child health issues such as prenatal care, adolescent health, the impact of daycare on a child's development, preventing injuries, healthy eating and lifestyle choices, and immunization.

Symbols

Images of health and active children are used in promotional materials such as posters, stickers and information kits for Child Health Day.

However, newspaper archives and other historical information show that the date was in fact observed on May 1 until 1960. Cruise to Cape Fair - September 11, 2021

Geez!

Great day for a cruise to Flat Creek Restaurant in Cape Fair,

What a great day for a road trip with friends and car club members. (40+). We noticed that the landscape and forest to Flat Creek was mostly a vivid green. That possibly meant that the area had a sufficient accumulation of rain this summer. I looked at a satellite map for the James River in that part of the state. I think that the definition of a winding river was started here.

We organized for the road trip at Marco's Pizza in Nixa, MO.

The Nixa area was first settled by farmers who located their farms along the wooded streams near present-day Nixa. The area became a crossroads, as it was a half-day ride with a team of horses from Springfield. Teamsters found it a convenient stopover site when hauling freight between Springfield and Arkansas. The village became known as Faughts. An early resident, Nicholas A. Inman, was a blacksmith from Tennessee, who set up a shop in 1852.

When a post office was opened, a town meeting was held to decide on a name for the new community. Because of his years of service to the community, the town was suggested to be named for him. Another suggestion was "nix" because the community was "nothing but a crossroads". The name

Nixa was finally decided upon, and Inman's middle initial "a" was added to get the unique name of Nixa.

The village incorporated on June 10, 1902.

And then on to Cape Fair, MO.

Cape Fair is an unincorporated community in Stone County, Missouri, United States. It is located on Route 76 and the southern terminus of Route 173. Cape Fair is on the west side of the James River arm of Table Rock Lake. The community is part of the Branson, Missouri Micropolitan Statistical Area.

A post office called Cape Fair has been in operation since 1851. The community most likely was named for the river cape or sharp stream that meander south of the original town site.

Hurley, MO

A post office called Hurley has been in operation since 1898. The name "Hurley" was assigned by postal officials.

Crane, MO

Crane was platted in 1895, taking its name from nearby Crane Creek. A post office called Crane has been in operation since 1887

Galena, MO

Galena was platted in 1852, and named for deposits of the ore galena near the original town site. An early variant name was "Jamestown". A post office has been in operation at Galena since 1853. The last public execution in the United

States took place in Galena in 1937.

Galena, also called lead glance, is the natural mineral form of lead sulfide (PbS). It is the most important ore of lead and an important source of silver.

Galena is one of the most

abundant and widely distributed sulfide minerals. It crystallizes in the cubic crystal system often showing octahedral forms. It is often associated with the minerals: sphalerite, calcite and fluorite.

And then we traveled to Red's Giant Hamburg for lunch.

Red's Giant Hamburg is a restaurant on U.S. Route 66 in Springfield, Missouri, which is believed to have been the world's first drive-through restaurant.

It reopened in 2019

Sheldon "Red" Chaney (May 20, 1916 – June 2, 1997) arrived in Springfield after World War II with a bride and a business degree. He purchased a small Sinclair gas station with several wooden motor court cabins tucked among trees on the back of the property. Eventually, a café was added in 1947. Growing weary of pumping gas and operating the motor court, the couple decided a better money-maker would be a restaurant. Since they owned a small herd of beef cattle (and would continue to raise their own beef until the close of the business), they decided to concentrate on hamburgers. The restaurant became a staple of Route 66 and the Springfield area until its closure in 1984. Red died in 1997 a few days after the restaurant was demolished, and Julia died in the early 2000s

Sign recreation

In 2013, a fundraising campaign was established to recreate the Red's Giant Hamburg sign. The sign was installed in 2015

Reopening

In early 2019, the Springfield Business Journal announced that Red's Giant Hamburg would be making a comeback 35 years after the original restaurant's closure. The new restaurant, located on Route 413, will be a recreation of the original Route 66 location. The project is being led by David Campbell, the owner of local BBQ chain Buckingham's, and insurance agent Greg Lott. The restaurant opened in August 2019.






