#### NSRA Mid-America Street Rod Nationals

The NSRA Mid-America Street Rod Nationals was held in Springfield and an all-time high number of participants and spectators were expected this year. Almost all of the Ozark Empire Fairgrounds will be utilized for the event as well as many of the buildings, which will house a large number of manufacturer and dealer displays and other attractions.

The host organization, NSRA, defines a street rod as a modernized vintage vehicle that must be of pre 1949 manufacture. These vehicles are equipped with the latest options available on the newest model



vehicles, including but not limited to disc brakes, air conditioning, cruise control, and tilt steering wheel. Most of those attending have updated the engine and drive train to enable the owner to cruise down the highway in comfort and safely maintain the speeds traveled by more modern vehicles. All vehicles must be driven on to the grounds. Included in this event are muscle cars, those factories produced high horsepower machines from the 60's and 70's along with the classics cars of the 50's. This is truly unique mix of old and new together for the first time at Ozark Empire Fairgrounds and a national gathering of fine vintage automobiles of every description. The NSRA Mid-America Street Rod Nationals is the area's largest automotive participation event and spectators from around the area will attend the event.

The NSRA Mid-America Street Rod Nationals is an excellent event for spectators to attend and those who take time to attend will be treated to the sights and sounds of some of the most beautiful, best constructed vintage vehicles ever assembled in one place. One of the special attractions for the spectators is that they can walk right up to the vehicles and check each one out close up as they are not roped-off or otherwise confined. All are in the open and can be examined top to bottom, front to back, inside and out. While the exquisite paint and other features of the car should not be touched, spectators are free to look to their hearts content.

Mitchell cars were produced from 1902 to 1923. Prior to that the company produced wagons, bicycles and motorcycles. In addition to the cars there were also wagons, a bicycle and a motorcycle at the museum.

Roslyn Heights Mansion was built in 1895 by wealthy Boonville couple Mr. and Mrs. Wilbur T Johnson. The home is now the state headquarters of the Daughters of the American Revolution.

The Warm Springs Ranch is the home of the Budweiser Clydesdale horses and is the breeding farm and hitch training facility. The group was fortunate enough to see four newborn foals which were only four days old.



A fun romp through the decades as we approach our clubs 45<sup>th</sup>

#### Highlights from 1936-1940...

Members with cars from these years are Jim and Donna Meyer with a 1936 Ford Humpback Sedan. The 1936 Ford style differed only slightly from the 1935 model with a longer, more pointed hood and a more sharply vee'd grill to match. 1937 brought crisp new bodies with the headlamps nestled in the fenders.

In 1936 Chevy adopted the "Turret Top" construction that eliminated old-fashioned fabric roof inserts. Chevy also offered hydraulic brakes for the first year which Ford wouldn't offer until 1939.

The strength of Ford and General Motors grew during these years. The late 1930's saw a consolidation of car manufacturers with only four major independents remaining by 1940. They were Nash, Hudson, Packard and Studebaker. (Information adapted from *Encyclopedia of American Cars*)


