




# CLASSIC COOKER

HOT CRANBERRY PUNCH - Myrtle St. John Servés 20-30

Boil 1 qt. water with 1 package whole cranberrys until very done. Let cool, use colander to get pulp and juice from cranberrys. In a <u>large</u> kettle over low heat mix pulp and juice with 4 qts. of water, 1 cup red hots, 3 1/2 cups sugar, 12 whole cloves, 1 small can frozen orange juice, 1 small can frozen lemonade. Make sure red hots melt and serve hot.

If you would like to serve it cold and 1 qt. seven-up.

## CLASSIC COOKER

PUMPKIN BREAD - Myrtle St. John

- 3 c. sugar
- 3 1/2 c. flour
- 2 tsp. soda
- 1 tsp. salt
- 1 tsp. cinnamon
- 1 1/4 c. salad oil
- 4 well beaten eggs
- 1 cup nuts
- 1 can pumpkin (regular size)

Sift dry ingredients in a bowl. Add remaining ingredients and mix well. Takes 4 1 lb. coffee cans greased well. Fill 1/2 full. Let cool. Replace lids and refrigerate or freeze. Bake at  $325^{\circ}$  for approx. 1 hour.
