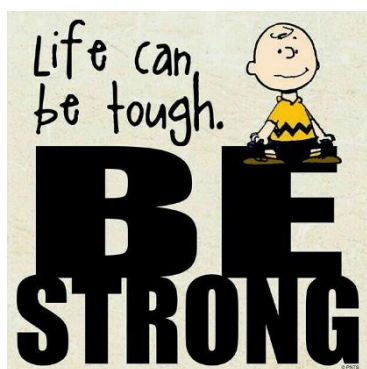

Mother's Day is May 10

Mother's Day in the United States is annually held on the second Sunday of May. It celebrates motherhood and it is a time to appreciate mothers and mother figures. Many people give gifts, cards, flowers, candy, a meal in a restaurant or other treats to their mother and mother figures, including grandmothers, great-grandmothers, stepmothers, and foster mothers.

Is Mother's Day a Public Holiday?

Mother's Day is not a public holiday. It falls on Sunday, May 10, 2020 and most businesses follow regular Sunday opening hours in the United States.

What Do People Do?

Many people send cards or gifts to their mother or mother figure or make a special effort to visit her. Common Mother's Day gifts are flowers, chocolate, candy, clothing, jewelry and treats, such as a beauty treatment or trip to a spa. Some families organize an outing for all of their members or hold a special meal at home or in a restaurant. In the days and weeks before Mother's Day, many schools help their pupils to prepare a handmade card or small gift for their mothers.

Public Life

Mother's Day is not a federal holiday. Organizations, businesses and stores are open or closed, just as they are on any other Sunday in the year. Public transit systems run to their normal Sunday schedules. Restaurants may be busier than usual, as some people take their mothers out for a treat.

Background

The origins of Mother's Day are attributed to different people. Many believe that two women, Julia Ward Howe and Anna Jarvis were important in establishing the tradition of Mother's Day in the United States. Other sources say that Juliet Calhoun Blakely initiated Mother's Day in Albion, Michigan, in the late 1800s. Her sons paid tribute to her each year and urged others to honor their mothers.

Around 1870, Julia Ward Howe called for Mother's Day to be celebrated each year to encourage pacifism and disarmament amongst women. It continued to be held in Boston for about ten years under her sponsorship, but died out after that.

In 1907, Anna Jarvis held a private Mother's Day celebration in memory of her mother, Ann Jarvis, in Grafton, West Virginia. Ann Jarvis had organized "Mother's Day Work Clubs" to improve health and cleanliness in the area where she lived. Anna Jarvis launched a quest for Mother's Day to be more widely recognized. Her campaign was later financially supported by John Wanamaker, a clothing merchant from Philadelphia.

In 1908, she was instrumental in arranging a service in the Andrew's Methodist Episcopal Church in Grafton, West Virginia, which was attended by 407 children and their mothers. The church has now become the International Mother's Day Shrine. It is a tribute to all mothers and has been designated as a National Historic Landmark.

Mother's Day has become a day that focuses on generally recognizing mothers' and mother figures' roles. Mother's Day has also become an increasingly important event for businesses in recent years. This is particularly true of restaurants and businesses manufacturing and selling cards and gift items.

Several things to know for the cruise:

Gas in Aurora is 40 cents a gallon higher than Nixa, so I would recommend gassing up before the cruise starts. Also, I cannot guarantee that any stations in Aurora have non-ethanol premium. (See change below)

The cruise, round trip from/to Nixa, is approximately 80 miles. It is 62 miles from Nixa to Republic. As you reach a good dropping off point after Republic (or before) to head home feel free to do so.

Although there are several drive-through eating places in Aurora I could only confirm use of a restroom at Braum's. For this reason, I recommend everyone eat in the parking lot of Braum's. If you choose to drive through another fast food location please come to Braum's parking lot to eat instead of Sutherlands as originally planned. We will leave Aurora to continue our cruise from the Braum's parking lot.

We will have a map available for everyone along with mileage marker guidance for turns.

I am very excited to see everyone and get out on what looks to be a beautiful day for a cruise. See everyone at 10 a.m. in the Marco's parking lot in Nixa.

A fun romp through the decades as we approach our clubs 45th anniversary in July 2020.

Highlights from ...1981-1990

Around 1982 horsepower began making a comeback. One of the first signs that the slump was over appeared in that year's Mustang GT. GM's offerings likewise began building more muscle; The Z28 Camaro's top engine went from 165bhp in 1982 to 215 by '85. And these were not exceptions to the rule; most every manufacturer boosted power outputs throughout the decade. 1982 also was the rebirth of the ragtop which had been discontinued in 1976. By mid decade GM had added several foreign made models to it's line up accounting for nearly 40 percent of sales. There were a few Detroit made standouts however. The Monte Carlo SS and Camaro continued strong sales by offering new packages and power options throughout the decade.

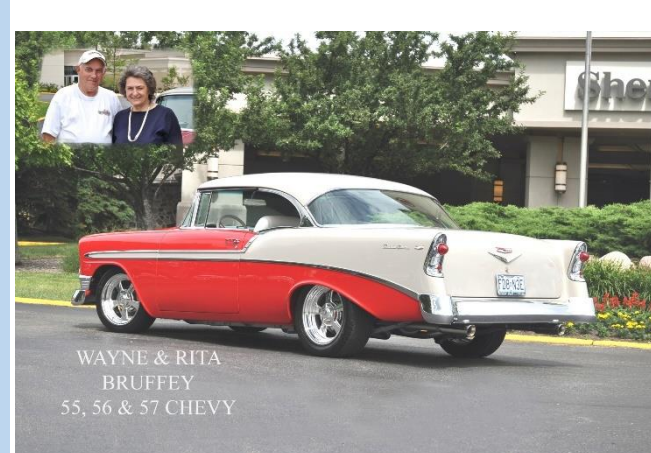
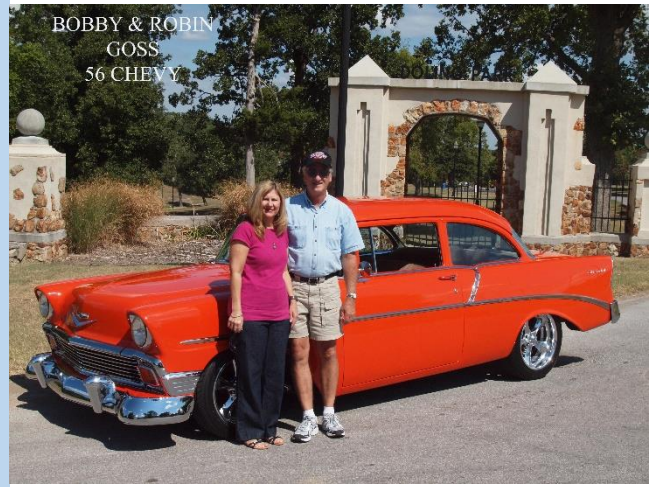
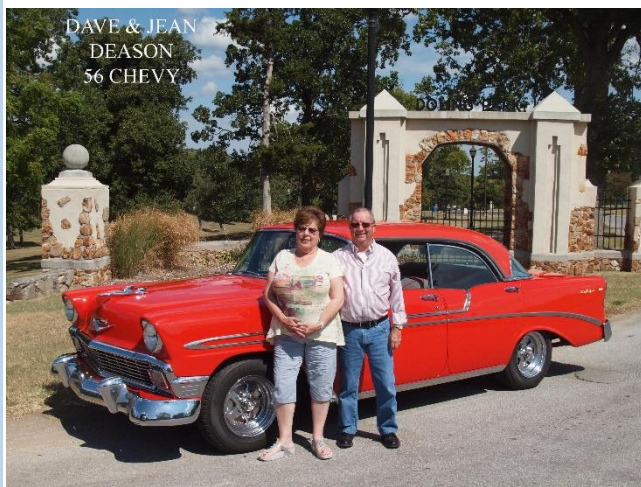

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Birth of the Mother Road

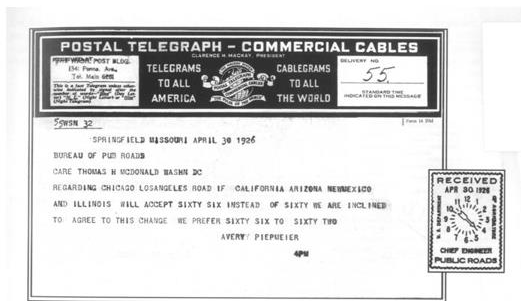
U.S. 66, also known as Route 66, the Mother Road, the Main Street of America, and the Will Rogers Highway, was officially named “U.S. 66,” via telegram at a meeting of highway officials in Springfield, Missouri on April 30, 1926. Calvin Coolidge was President, Prohibition was still in full swing, motion pictures were a year away from becoming “talkies,” and Henry Ford had just lowered the price of the automobile. The stage was set for what would become not only the country’s first cross-country highway, but an enduring piece of Americana that travelers from around the world still yearn to experience. In 1992, on the Mother Road’s 66th anniversary, the Route 66 Association of Missouri designated Springfield as the official Birthplace of Route 66 with a placard, now located on the east side of Park Central Square

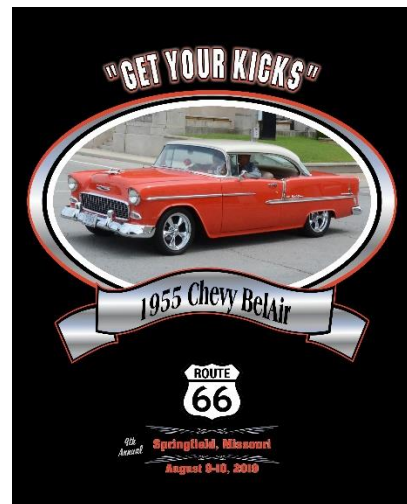
